SA Cudmore is currently the Weapons of Mass Destruction Coordinator for the Kansas City office of the FBI. In this position he conducts criminal and intelligence investigations including investigations of terrorist acts planned or carried out by foreign/domestic groups in the United States: collects, analyzes, and disseminates intelligence on terrorist groups and activities; and has served and will serve as the federal on-scene representative in a weapons of mass destruction incident for the Kansas City Division.

From August 2002 through October 2002, Agent Cudmore was selected for temporary duty assignment to Pakistan, where he dedicated his time to very high level international terrorism matters. He participated in terrorist interviews, arrests and searches while in this assignment, one of which involved the interrogation of Ramzi Benalshibh, who is believed to be the 20<sup>th</sup> hijacker, captured on 09/11/2002 in Pakistan.

Agent Cudmore took part in a national investigative strategy involving the September 2001 anthrax investigation in which Agent Cudmore completed 33 top priority comprehensive lab initiative interviews throughout the Midwest.

Special Agent Cudmore has been involved in the following positions: served as an active duty, United States Army Nuclear Biological Chemical (NBC) Officer during the Gulf War, served as the State of Nebraska Radiological Emergency Response Officer (responsible for the state response to a nuclear power plant incident), a Federal Emergency Management Agency hazardous material response instructor to include hazardous material instruction for awareness, operational, technician, specialist and incident command levels, and served as Chief of Emergency Planning for the State of Nebraska.
