Dennis Moore, a lifelong Kansan, is serving his fourth term in the U.S. House of Representatives.

Congressman Moore has compiled an impressive record of bipartisanship and has developed a reputation as one who will reach across the aisle to develop common sense solutions to issues. Moore’s signature trait is tireless advocacy for his constituents. At the end of his third term as District Attorney, Moore again returned to private practice. He was a partner in the law firm of Erker & Moore, LLC.

Then, beginning in 1993, Moore served as an elected member of the Johnson County Community College Board of Trustees. Moore was elected to two terms as a member of the Johnson County Community College Board of Trustees.

He was educated in Wichita public schools. In 1967, he graduated from the University of Kansas, and received his law degree from Washburn University School of Law in 1970.

Moore is a member of the House Committees on the Budget, Banking and Financial Services, Associations and Science. He is on a leave of absence from the House Small Business Committee during the 108th Congress.
